The "why" is the reason for the ministry of CEF of Schuylkill County.

*16,500 elementary age children

*59.5% of people in Schuylkill County are religious~ of that 59.5% only 15% are Baptist, Episcopalian, Methodist, Pentecostal, and Presbyterian¹

*Today only 50% of adults are married²

*27% of adults say their religious views are a factor in a good family arrangement²

*71% of adults say they get fulfillment from having a career or job they love² (having children wasn't even part of the equation)

*We are seeing the first generation of adults who have never attended church raising children who do not attend church

*The world is promoting genderconfusion

*In 2022 a study found that only 39% of Americans read their Bible multiple times a year.³

*Currently only about 10% of Americans read their Bible daily³

All these statistics point to that fact that the majority of the children in Schuylkill County do not attend church, do not hear the Bible read (they may not even have a Bible in their home), and have parents who have no interest in their children knowing God, man's need for a Savior, and the Way of salvation.

It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year! Christmas Party Club Time!

A recent study found that only 12% of those between the ages of 9-24 go to church or religious gatherings. Nearly 40% describe themselves as religiously unaffiliated, meaning agnostic, atheist, or nothing in particular. Sixty percent of this group describe them-



selves as spiritual. This is the age group that will soon be, or is raising the next generation. If those who are in their early 20s are not attending a Bible teaching church, what will it be like for their children, our communities, and our world?

Help us reach the children ages 5-12 with the Gospel.

CEF of Schuylkill County will supply the lesson, memory verse, and game ideas. This year's lesson is <u>How Turea Kept Christmas</u>. The story is about a little girl from Morocco who comes to know Jesus as her Savior at school. When she returns home she tries to hide that she is a Christian, but comes to realize the meaning of John 1:11-12 "He came unto His, and His own received Him not. But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name."

In telling this story you will be sharing the Christmas story and the promise of salvation along with a challenge to be a witness for Christ in a dying world.

A Christmas Party Club can be for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, focusing on the lesson, verse, review, songs, games and snack. Or your church could do a four hour outreach giving parents an opportunity to get some shopping done, wrap presents, bake cookies...you get the idea. One mom told us she took the hours to volunteer with another nearby ministry. Here's a sample schedule:

10:00-10:30 Welcome and games

10:30-11:30 Lesson/verse/songs/review game

11:30-12:00 Cookie decorating (we baked cookies earlier in the week~

12:00-12:30 Lunch (hotdogs, chips, fruit)

12:30-1:00 Games/craft

1:00-1:30 Movie and Popcorn

1:30-2:00 Cookies and hot chocolate
